Lourdes Fundraising group — Christmas Bazaar

Our annual Christmas Bazaar was held in the Church Hall on Saturday, 26th November. Stalls included three

During the year we also held a coffee morning and a soup lunch. The funds we raise are used to send sick pilgrims on the Diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes each May. Last year we were

able to fund three pilgrims and we hope to fund at least four pilgrims this year. Anyone wishing to go to Lourdes as a sick pilgrim can apply to the group through the Parish office for financial assistance.

Good Hope Hospital Eucharistic Ministers

Every Sunday morning, Good Hope Hospital is visited by a small group of Eucharistic Ministers, who bring Holy Communion to the sick (and sometimes relatives or staff members who can't get to Mass that day). They also pray with any patients who request them to do so, including non-Catholics.

The ministry is run on a rota basis, and Ministers make 4 or 5 visits in a quarter. More volunteers for this service are always welcome, and it is not necessary to be a Eucharistic Minister already, as training will be given. It is necessary to be reasonably fit, as there is quite a lot of walking involved.

Lourdes Pilgrimage

May to take part in the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes. The theme was The Year of Mercy. The opening procession through the Door of Mercy had to be cancelled due to a heavy storm, but was rescheduled later in the week. We had Mass each day and also the opportunity to visit the baths, attend a service of Reconciliation and the sick were anointed at a special service. Bishop Walsh School led the Candlelight procession and the Blessed Sacrament procession. We all returned six days later very tired, but spiritually refreshed.

The pilgrimage takes place at the end of May each year and is led by the Archbishop. New pilgrims are always very welcome and bookings can be made through the Parish office.

BIRCH – Helping Asylum Seekers

Pope Francis says the Easter message of the risen Christ "invites us not to forget those men and women seeking a better futurefleeing from war, hunger, poverty and social injustice". "All too often, these brothers and sisters of ours meet along the way with death or, in any event rejection by those who could offer them welcome and assistance."

In the spirit of this message, my wife and I met with an official asylum organisation called BIRCH who provide a support framework for individuals or couples who are willing to 'host' an asylum seeker. In September we become volunteer hosts to a young (32 years) Iranian Christian convert called Lazaros.

Key Asylum Statistics

Asylum applications stood at 32,414 in 2015.

In 2015, 64% of asylum applications were initially refused.

In 2015, 35% of appeals were allowed. Men made up nearly 3 out of 4 (73%).

The UK received 3% of asylum claims made in EU countries (plus Norway and Switzerland) in 2015, making it the tenth highest recipient of asylum claims.

In 2015, 1,194 Syrians were resettled through the Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Programme.

Preparation for Baptism

The early Church leaders wrote in the Nicene Creed (A.D. 381), "We believe in one baptism for the forgiveness of sins."

It is a great joy that so many parents still desire this 'one baptism for the forgiveness of sins' in Sutton Coldfield! In 2016, our parish welcomed almost 80 children into our community through the Sacrament of Baptism. That far exceeds the number baptised in the previous three years and justifies the expansion of St. Joseph's Primary School to two-form entry to support the catholic education of these children. It is a delight to see parents bring their young families to Mass, particularly the 9.00 a.m. Family Mass each Sunday, supporting the formation and growth of faith. Parents requesting baptism in our parish are required to attend a meeting of preparation after provisionally booking their child's baptism through the Parish Office. The meetings take place in the Conference Room, usually on the second Sunday of the month, at 3 p.m. Booking forms are available in the church porch. Baptisms usually take place on Sunday at 12.30 p.m.

Young ex-offenders, some who have been disowned by their family, are given a sense of worth when they are given a personal Christmas card and gifts. Their appreciation is wonderful. So grateful thanks to all parishioners who contribute these valuable gifts.

Refugees, asylum seekers and immigrants who visit St Chad's Sanctuary in Birmingham (a joint venture by the Catholic Diocese and the Salvation Army) are given support with your help. They are given food, clothing and various other help to enable them to survive and integrate with society in this, a country strange to them. It is amazing how much you give. Thank you.

A Christmas appeal for additional SVP helpers has resulted in several people expressing interest, and we hope that this results in a commitment to join the SVP team. Saint Vincent de Paul - Sacred Heart



We meet once a fortnight after the Friday evening Mass. The meetings consist of prayers, a spiritual reading and reports and discussions of the work we do.

We have 5 full members and our spiritual director is Father Cousins. There are also 4 auxiliary members who help with the lunches and can be available in emergencies. Our work is mainly visiting people in their homes, in hospital and in care (in particular we visit several people at Fotherly).

Each year we send money to two parishes in India and at Christmas we give to two of the poorer parishes in Birmingham. We also support the pupils at Bishop Walsh who help at Lourdes. In addition, we support the young ex-prisoners; at Reach House in Erdington and there is a box in the hall where people can put gifts for them.

Once a month we provide a 2 course hot meal for between 28/28 elderly people and their careers. They come from parishes at the Sacred Heart, Holy Trinity and St. Nicholas and it doesn't matter what religion they are. Most of them get out very little and appreciate the monthly get-together.

We are registered with Good Hope and the Stroke association. We do make a small charge and in August and December take all out to a local pub for lunch.

Financial Report

Thanks to the generosity of many parishioners the Parish is now clear of all debt. Loans totalling £35,000 have been repaid during the year.

Despite a further reduction in Offertory income a substantial surplus has been achieved for the year after absorbing the cost of new central heating boilers for the Church. However, we need to be mindful of needs for the future; the Church is due for re-decorating for example and it is important to build up reserves to meet the ever increasing costs of maintenance.

Gift Aid - 2016

We have 195 donors in the Parish scheme. total donations for the claim for the last tax year were £70,308. and the tax recovered from HMIT to the parish was £17,773.

Sadly we have lost a number of generous donors over the past year and need more tax paying parishioners to join. There is no extra cost above your usual offering but the parish gets back the tax you have paid on it. **Contact Howard** on 0121 323 4205
